James Robinson is Leonard D. Schaeffer Professor of Health Economics and Director of the Berkeley Center for Health Technology (BCHT) at the University of California at Berkeley. His professional activities include his roles as Senior Director for Medical Technology at the Integrated Healthcare Association (IHA), Contributing Editor for Health Affairs journal, and as keynote speaker for conferences, policy roundtables, and board meetings. At Berkeley, Professor Robinson teaches health policy and economics, focusing on the biotechnology, medical device, insurance, physician, and hospital sectors. He has published two books and over 100 papers in scientific and policy journals such as the New England Journal of Medicine, JAMA, and Health Affairs. At the Integrated Healthcare Association, Dr. Robinson is a member of the Board of Directors and assumes a leadership role on projects including value-based purchasing for medical devices, episode-of-care payment for high-cost surgical procedures, benefit design and consumer cost sharing, and Accountable Care Organization structure.
